

HOLLYWOOD JET'AIME


Dir: Jason Bushman, USA, 2009, video, 97 min

Freshly dumped, Jerome swaps Paris for California in the hope of finding some sun, an acting job and men – anything to keep his mind off his cheating ex. When he arrives, it's not the paradise he imagined, but he soon meets prostitute Kaleesha, who takes a real shine to our puppy-dog-eyed loner, and who introduces him to drag queen, Norma Desire, and with nowhere to stay Jerome crashes at Norma's place. Things seem to be working out for our leading man when he meets gay pot dealer, Ross (Chad Allen, Save Me [MQFF 2008]), who introduces him to an agent friend and he soon scores an acting gig... on a microwave pizza commercial. Ah, the glamour of Hollywood!

Lovers of classic Hollywood films will have fun spotting the references to such films as Sunset Boulevard and Wizard Of Oz – with its fading from black-and-white to colour, to the 'there's no place like home' maxim – and many more... one of the most popular films on the queer film festival circuit, Hollywood Je T'aime is plenty of fun. Everett and Miles live in relative seclusion in a small town with their learning disabled son, Billy. Their relationship is passionless and they seem to be held together by their shared loved of the child. When Miles and Billy take a trip out of town to visit family, Everett is thankful for some time to be by himself. However his peace is interrupted by the arrival of a handsome stranger, Chase, a writer who has taken a wrong turn on the way to his B&B. Their mutual attraction is instant, and they start spending time together. Openly flirtatious and carefree, Chase tries to seduce the more serious Everett, who is torn between risk and responsibility.

AND THEN CAME LOLA

Dir: Ellen Seidler & Megan Siler, USA, 2009, video, 73 min

Owing a huge (tongue in) cheeky debt to 1998's Run, Lola Run, the film that put Tom Tykwer's firmly onto the world cinema map, this first feature from the do-it-all duo (credited for writing, directing, producing and operating the camera) Seidler and Siler (who on her own made The Midwife's Tale in 1995) is as light as a soufflé and frothier than a cappuccino. It's also as delicious as both, but much sexier than either.

Ashleigh Sumner displays buckets of charisma as the eponymous Lola, a somewhat shiftless and perpetually unpunctual photographer who doesn't like to be tied down, but is on the cusp of finally uttering the C word (we're talking about commitment - keep yourselves nice) with her current squeeze, Casey (Jill Bennett). The film's plot revolves around Lola trying to get some photographic prints to Casey in time for an important job opportunity. Said opportunity is being offered by Casey's silky smooth ex-girlfriend (Cathy DeBuono), so there's a little more at stake than simply a graphic design contract. And did we mention that Lola has to run through the whole rigmarole several times? With different obstacles and outcomes on each occasion? (Madeleine Swain - MQFF)

PROJECTING THE BODY

Director Walter McIntosh, Australia, 2008, 55 min

Filmmaker Stephen Cummins blazed a trail through the tumultuous 1980s, examining oppression, desire, and the politics of sexuality.

Reacting against the environment of AIDS paranola and ensuinghomophobia, Stephen created films that are bold in their politics andbeautiful in their poetry. Projecting the Body is an intimate look at Stephen Cummins' life andcareer, bringing together his film and photographic work, rare homemovies and snaps as well as interviews withAt a time when there were almost no gay or lesbian characters inAustralian film and television, Stephen made Resonance (1992), the first gay-themed film to be funded by the Australian Film Commission.

Resonance fused narrative with dance to tackle the issue of anti-gayviolence, and was an Australian voice in the emerging 'New Queer Cinema'. Resonance went on to become the most exhibited Australian short film of the 1990s and screened at over 40 international film festivals.

An examination of Stephen's films reveals an ongoing fascination with the many meanings attached to representations of the body; the body as landscape, the body as carvas, the body in public space, limitations of the freedom of the body, and finally the body under attack. An increasing political consciousness as a gay man moved him to gradually view the positioning of the body in relation to the outside world, exposing inequalities and injustice. Walter McIntosh – Director Walter graduated with a Masters of Arts in Film and Television Editing (Documentary) from the Australian Film, Television and Radio School (AFTRS) in 2004. Sentences, a film he edited at AFTRS, won Best Short Documentary at the Australian Inside Film Awards in 2005. Walter also edited the documentary The Prodigal Son, which received the audience award for Best Film at the 2006 Flickerfest Festival and won Best Short Documentary at the 2006 IF Awards.

Walter was co-director and editor of Darkness Over Paradise, a documentary about civil war in Sierra Leone. He recently edited the short film Kriss Kross and the documentary Lesbanese. He is currently completing his PhD at the University of Sydney, researching the use of poetic aesthetics in autobiographical documentaries. Projecting the Body is Walter's first film as director.

Walter McIntosh will introduce his documentary and conduct a Question & Answer session with patrons at it's conclusion.



DROOL

Dir: Nancy Kissam, USA, 2009, video, 88 min

Hands up all those of you who have been waiting impatiently for Laura Harring to return to the fold? It's eight years since Harring (then credited as Laura Elena Harring) joined Naomi Watts to create one of cinema's greatest ever Sapphic pairings in David Lynch's masterpiece Mulholland Drive. And now she's back. Drool is a very, very different movie - although it does also turn on Harring's character being rescued from an untenable position by a wonderful woman. Written and directed by first-timer Kissam, Drool is a gleeful black comedy wearing a technicolour dreamcoat. Anora (Harring) is a downtrodden wife with a fairytale fantasy life, who gets to live it for real when the effervescent Imogene (Jill Marie Jones) knocks on her door and invites her for coffee.

What transpires includes an accidentally disposed of husband, a couple of disgruntled children and a cross country trip to meet the queen of a beauty products empire, a woman fabulous enough to have popped straight out of a John Waters movie. As an aside, Harring has also recently played Alla Nazimova (the lesbian silent screen star) in the long gestating Return to Babylon, but don't hold your breath waiting to see that any time soon. Sarah Ward

Sarah Ward is a cabaret artist, writer, composer, musical director, clown and poet.

Sarah graduated from Actors Centre Australia in 2000 with a Diploma of Acting and guickly decided that she would never 'fit in' to the mainstream industry so focused on creating an act that would challenge the status quo; from this approach Sista She was born.

Sista She was a queer, feminist, hip-hop cabaret act. They toured the country from 2003 - 2008 with live shows Inna Thigh-The Sista She Story, The Naked MC and The House Of The Holy Bootay.

Over those five years Sista She performed at many festivals including the Adelaide Cabaret Festival, Edinburgh Fringe Festival, Sydney Mardi Gras Festival, Melbourne International Comedy Festival and Melbourne Fringe Festival and were awarded the Directors Choice Award 2004. They also performed at various music venues and theatres' including the Studio Opera House, Brisbane Powerhouse, the Melbourne Arts Centre, the State Theatre and a squat where the police were called and they were locked inside the building till the early hours of the morning.

Immediately after graduating Sarah performed with a Sydney based 12 piece Big Band The KJ All-stars and composed and performed with a Jazz Trio. She also joined a small performance ensemble and wrote scripts and song for a once a month showing called 'A Bit On Th Side'. This performance ensemble was facilitated by Lisa Shouw 'Girl Overboard' and Cat Wilson. In 2003 Sarah wrote and composed for a short film Not What I Expected and became a Tropfest finalist. In 2006 and 2007 she co-musically directed the Women's Circus show A Plane Without Wings Is A Rocket and The Antechamber. In 2008 and 2009 Sarah was commissioned to compose and musically direct songs for an upcoming cabaret (not yet titled) for the Melbourne Workers Theatre. This show will be directed by Maude Davey and performed by Sarah Ward, alongside Bec Matthews and Ania Reynolds from Tha Paranas; it is set to premiere in 2010.

In 2007 Sarah Ward created the fierce and fragile cabaret poet Yana Alana and her award-winning show with Tha Paranas, Bite Me, was presented at the Melbourne Fringe, the Midsumma Festival, the Adelaide Cabaret Festival, the Arts Centre and the Melbourne International Comedy Festival.






