Dir: Lee Galea, Australia, 2012, 85 min When Mike's English teacher pairs him up for a class assignment about Romeo & Juliet with the cute new guy Will, Mike can't believe his luck. However, as the two spend more and more time working together on a monster movie version of the Bard's classic tale, they both soon realise their feelings for one another may be more powerful than either of them is truly ready for. But like the two main characters in the greatest love story ever told, Mike and Will seem pre-destined to be kept apart by their respective dysfunctional families, by their classmates, and by their own sexual confusion. Can their love overcome all obstacles? Or, like the Shakespearian monsters that inhabit their school project, are they fated to spend their exis-

tence haunted and alone? A coming-out and coming-of-age drama firmly set in the 1990's, Monster Pies is a snapshot in time, a moving teen romance unafraid to tackle the contradictions and complexities of the male adolescent heart and mind.

UNFIT: WARDS VS WARD

Dir: Katie Carmichael, Edwin Scharlau & Penny Edmiston, USA, 2012, 90 min

Who is the more fit to be a parent? A mother who is lesbian or a father who is a convicted murderer?

In 1995, a Florida judge was presented with a custody modification case. The couple in question had been separated and then divorced for six years. At the time of the divorce, primary custody of their only daughter had been awarded to the mother. She requested, and was granted, child support well below the Florida state guideline, as she knew that her ex-husband was not in a position to pay more and she wanted him to remain a part of their daughter's life. Yet mounting bills and a loss of income forced the mother to file for an increase in child support, which she was awarded. Yet, the case began to unravel when the father filed for a complete modification of the custody arrangement, despite the fact that he is behind in child support payments, knows very little about his daughter, nor has spent much time with her, and has done jail time for the murder of his first wife. While the judge claims that the mother's lesbianism had nothing to do with his decision his ruling stated that "...I believe that this child should be given the opportunity and the option to live in a non-lesbian world..." If you think what ensues can't happen in contemporary society, think again.

KISS ME (aka: WITH EVERY HEARTBEAT)

Grappling with intense family drama at home, Rebecca escapes into the oasis of her encounters with Paris. Meanwhile, outside of her lucrative sex-worker day-job, Paris is a struggling artist with troubles of her own.
